What is Host Home Care?

Caring individuals and families are needed to provide Host Home services for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who are participants in the Home and Community-Based Services Program (HCS) with Heart of Texas Region MHMR Center.

HCS Host Home Care is provided in an individual's private residence for up to three adult participants. The Host Home provider is responsible for the care and well-being of each individual, by ensuring that their daily needs are met in a family home setting. The provider will encourage the development of skills in order to promote independence in areas such as:

- Life skills development
- Meal planning and preparation
- Grocery and personal shopping
- Grooming, eating, bathing, dressing, and hygiene
- Emergency procedures and personal safety
- Participation in community and leisure activities

The Host Home Provider receives a monthly income as a contractor with the Center, in addition to a Room and Board payment by each participant (if applicable).

A LIFETIME OF REWARDS

If asked to choose one word to describe what it means to be a foster care provider for intellectually disabled adults, I would choose "rewarding". When I became a host home provider, I wanted to help those less fortunate than me. I didn't realize how much they would give back to me.

Being single with grown children, it was a lonely house to come home to. I have been a provider for the same two ladies for eight years. Each of us had to learn the likes, dislikes and needs of the other, and also to respect, be understanding, and have patience. This did not happen overnight. It took time, but it was time well spent. We do everything together from grocery shopping to going out to eat, movies, and road trips from coast-to-coast to visit family members. When one of us is ill, the others are concerned and caring. We laugh, we cry, we get angry, because we are family.

I offered a home, love, and stability. I received companionship, a feeling of usefulness, appreciation and love in return. I have a fulfilling life and I have a home again. Yes, being a host home provider is very rewarding.
