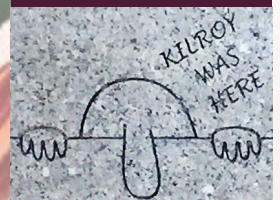
EOAC Budget Class

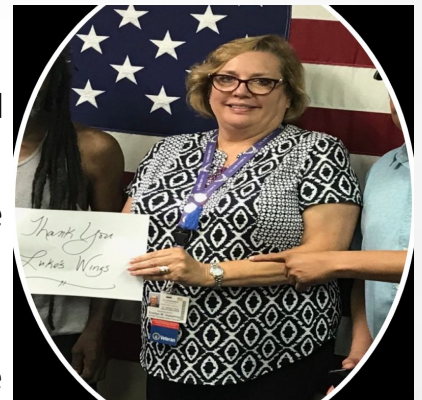
Staff Spotlight: Angie Jaramillo
